OUR HISTORY

South Carolina Connections Academy (SCCA) is an accredited, public school serving students in grades K–12 from across the state. Our students come from urban, suburban, and rural communities. The school was founded during the 2008–09 school year as a K–12 school. South Carolina Connections Academy graduated its first 12th grade class in June 2009. The Class of 2021 included 579 graduates.

OUR PROGRAM

South Carolina Connections Academy offers a K-12 comprehensive school program with an enrollment of approximately 6,500 students' school-wide, and 2,500 students in grades 9-12. Here are some important facts about the school:

- The school is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges & Schools Council on Accreditation and School Improvement (SACS CASI), an accrediting division of Cognia, formerly AdvanceD.
- School is in session 180 days between the months of August and June.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

South Carolina Connections Academy operates on a semester system utilizing Carnegie units. One semester class equals one-half of a high school credit. Students who have taken high school level courses while in middle school may have been granted high school credit. The typical course load is six classes per semester. 24 Carnegie units of credit are required for graduation. Specific requirements include:





GRADE SCALE

South Carolina Connections Academy uses the South Carolina Uniform Grading Scale. A student's transcript reflects weighted grades if the student took Honors or Advanced Placement courses. No credit is awarded for grades of 59% or less.

The numerical grading scale is as follows:

Class rank is calculated twice each year, at the conclusion of each semester. Class rank is based upon the student's cumulative weighted G.P.A. for all high school courses (excluding Pass/Fail and Incomplete), including transfer courses. Senior class rank is only assigned to successful Spring Graduates.

South Carolina was approved to waive the 95% participation rate requirements for assessments, accountability, and certain reporting requirements in the Elementary and Secondary Education Act for the 2020-21 school year.

Given the waiver, there was no penalty at the student, teacher, school, district, or state level for a student who did not complete the applicable assessment(s). SCCA's School District, Charter Institute at Erskine, waived the twenty percent final grade requirements for End-of Course (EOC) exams and allowed a school-administered final exam to take the place of the EOC requirements. Students were offered EOC Exams along with non-federally required assessments related to college and career readiness, including Ready to Work, SAT, ACT and Advanced Placement, but were allowed to opt out of testing in the 2020-21 School Year.
