

COURSE OFFERINGS

Kansas Connections Academy’s core curriculum is geared toward preparing students for college and beyond. Students have access to AP, Honors, College Preparatory, and Basic programs. Students also have the opportunity to earn high school credit through most college courses taken during high school as well.

In 2016-17 KCA had 13.5% of 11th and 12th grade students participate in AP or Dual Enrollment courses. Please contact Paul Walrod with questions.

AP course offerings include: Biology, Calculus AB, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Psychology, Spanish, U.S. Government.

Honors course offerings include: Algebra I & II, American Government, Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, English 9-12, Geometry, Marine Science, Physical Science, Precalculus, U.S. History, and World History. Honors Physical Science; Honors Pre-calculus; Honors United States History; and Honors World History.

GRADING SCALE

The numerical grading scale is as follows:
