### OUR HISTORY

Indiana Connections Career Academy (INCC) is a tuition-free, virtual public school option available for students in grades 9-12 throughout Indiana. It was established in the 2017-2018 school year



## OUR PROGRAM

Indiana Connections Career Academy offers a comprehensive high school program with a projected enrollment of 500 students in grades 9-12.

- A partner school of Indiana Connections Academy, which is also authorized by Ball State University.
- The school has 25 certified/licensed professional staff. Of those, 7 have earned advanced degrees, and 8 are highly qualified.
- School is in session 180 days between the months of August and June.
- Students must participate in standardized assessments mandated by the State of Indiana. Testing is facilitated at locations throughout the state.
- Students are required to enroll in career pathway-focused courses each year. CTE adjunct instructors facilitate courses including Web Design A & B, Health Education I, Culinary Arts & Hospitality I, and Introduction to Manufacturing.
- All students are encouraged to participate in Career Exploration, an independent study course that provides the framework for internships, work study, and other hands-on experiences related to their identified pathways. Students are provided opportunities to attend monthly field trips, college visits, and other school events.
- INCC's first graduating class in 2020 yielded 92 students.
