### OUR PROGRAM

New Mexico Connections Academy is approved by the NM Public Education Department and an accredited, public charter school serving students in grades 4-12 across the state. NMCA includes a four-year comprehensive high school program. The school was founded in the 2013-14 school year, with the first senior class graduating in May 2014. NMCA is a rigorous alternative to the traditional public school that encourages students to maximize their individual learning potential in a more flexible environment. The curriculum at NMCA is challenging and well designed to prepare students for their post-high school choices, and all curriculum is taught by New Mexico Certified teachers.

Important facts about the program:

- New Mexico Connections Academy is accredited by the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement (NCA CASI,) an accrediting division of Cognia, formerly AdvancedED.
- The school has 80 certified/licensed professional staff.
- School is in session 180 days between August and May.
- Students can earn a maximum of 7.5 credits during the school year.

## STUDENT POPULATION

- Our students come from urban, suburban, and rural communities. Our current enrollment cap is 1300, which includes a limit of 160 for seniors. Student demographics include: White (30%), Hispanic (50%), Native Hawaiian or Other Pacific Islander (1%), African American (6%), Asian (3%), and American Indian or Alaskan Native (10%).

## ADVANCED COURSE OPTIONS

- **AP Course Offerings Include:** Biology, Calculus AB, Computer Science A, English Language & Composition, English Literature and Composition, Environmental Science, and U.S. History
- **Honors Course Offerings Include:** Algebra I and II, American Government, Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, Earth Space Science, English 9-12, Geometry, Physical Science, Physics, Pre-Calculus, U.S. History, and World History.

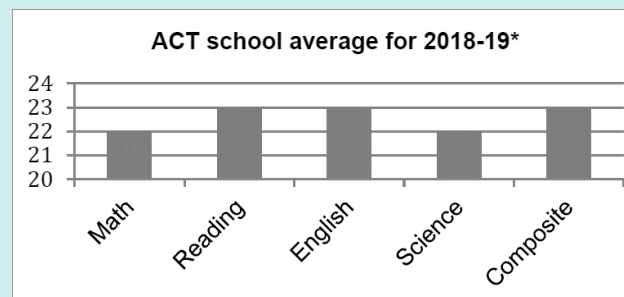
