ADVANCED COURSE OPTIONS

Oklahoma Connections Academy's core curriculum is geared toward preparing students for college and beyond. Students have access to AP, Honors, College Preparatory courses, and the Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) program, in which they can earn dual high school and college credit by attending post-secondary institutions.

AP course offerings include: Art History, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Computer Science A, Computer Science Principles, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, Environmental Science, European History, Human Geography, Physics, Pre-Calculus, Psychology, Spanish, Statistics, U.S. Government, U.S. History, and World History.

Honors course offerings include: Algebra I and II, American Government, Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, English 9-12, Geometry, Pre-Calculus, U.S. History, and World History.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

OKCA operates on a semester system utilizing Carnegie units. One semester class equals one-half of a high school credit. Students who have taken high school level courses while in middle school may have been granted high school credit. The typical course load is six classes per semester. The twenty-three Carnegie units of credit required for graduation listed below are applicable from now through the graduating class of 2029.
