OUR HISTORY

Willamette Connections Academy is a tuition free virtual public school serving students in grades K-12 from across the state. Our students come from urban, suburban, and rural communities. The school was founded during the 2019-2020 school year as a K-12 school. The school's first 12th grade class graduated in June of 2020.

OUR PROGRAM

Willamette Connections Academy is a four-year comprehensive high school program serving students throughout Oregon in grades K-12. Here are some important facts about our program:

- The school has 62 certified/licensed professional staff. Many of the teachers and staff hold multiple state teaching certifications in a variety of areas, along with master's degrees and higher.
- School is in session 180 days between the months of September and June.
- Students on the traditional pacing can earn up to 6 credits during the school year. The typical course load is 6 classes per semester. However, students can take additional courses if requested by student or caretaker.
- The school operates on a semester system.
- One semester class equals one-half of a high school credit.
- Students who have taken high school level courses while in middle school may have been granted high school credit.
