OUR HISTORY

South Carolina Connections Academy (SCCA) is an accredited, public school serving students in grades K-12 from across the state. Our students come from urban, suburban, and rural communities. The school was founded during the 2008-09 school year as a K-12 school. South Carolina Connections Academy graduated its first 12th grade class in June 2009. The Class of 2023 included 570 graduates.

OUR PROGRAM

South Carolina Connections Academy offers a K-12 comprehensive school program with an enrollment of approximately 6,300 students school-wide, and 2,900 students in grades 9-12. Here are some important facts about the school:

- The school is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges & Schools Council on Accreditation and School Improvement (SACS CASI), an accrediting division of Cognia.
- School is in session 180 days between the months of August and May.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

In the 2022-23 School Year and prior, South Carolina Connections Academy operated on a semester system utilizing Carnegie units. One semester class equaled one-half of a high school credit. Students who have taken high school level courses while in middle school may have been granted high school credit. The typical course load is six classes per semester. 24 Carnegie units of credit are required for graduation. Specific requirements include:





GRADE SCALE

South Carolina Connections Academy uses the South Carolina Uniform Grading Scale. A student's transcript reflects weighted grades if the student took Honors or Advanced Placement courses. No credit is awarded for grades of 59% or less.

In the 2022-23 School Year and prior, class rank was calculated twice each year, at the conclusion of each semester. In the 2022-23 School Year, SCCA courses will be year-long for one full credit, and class rank will be calculated at the conclusion of the spring semester.

Class rank is based upon the student's cumulative weighted G.P.A. for all high school courses (excluding Pass/Fail and Incomplete), including transfer courses. Senior class rank is calculated for enrolled 12th Grade students at the end of the academic year.

ACCREDITATION



As a public school, SCCA is held accountable to meeting the 95% participation rate requirement in accordance with the Elementary and Secondary Education Act. In addition, by the time students graduate high school, they must satisfy the college and career readiness requirement demonstrating their preparedness for college or a career upon graduation. In order to demonstrate this, students are required to earn a minimum on the ACT, SAT, AP exam, or National Career Readiness Assessment or meet dual enrollment requirements or earn a minimum score on the ASVAB.
