OUR PROGRAM

Washington Connections Academy Goldendale has a comprehensive high school program with a projected enrollment of 1600 students in grades K-12. Here are some important facts about our program:

- The school has over 100 professional staff. All teachers, counselors, and administrators are certified.
- School is in session 180 days between the months of September and June.
- Students on the traditional pacing can earn up to 8 credits during the school year. The typical course load is 6-7 classes per semester.
- The school operates on a semester system utilizing Carnegie units.
- One semester class equals one-half of a high school credit.
- Washington Connections Academy Goldendale is accredited by the Northwest Accreditation Commission (NWAC), an accrediting division of Cognia.
- In 2022 Washington Connections Academy was designated as a School of Distinction through Cognia.

ADVANCED COURSE OPTIONS

Washington Connections Academy Goldendale's core curriculum is geared toward preparing students for college and beyond. Students have access to Honors, Advance Placement, College Preparatory, and Basic programs.

Honors course offerings include:

English 9-10, Algebra I and II, Geometry, Biology, Chemistry, Civics, and World History.

Advanced Placement course offerings include:

Computer Science Principles, English Language and Composition, US History, Psychology, Calculus, and Statistics.
