OUR MISSION

It is the mission of Wyoming Connections Academy to support students as they grow in their learning journey by teaming with families. Students will strengthen their ownership, independence, and confidence in preparation for graduation and beyond.

OUR PROGRAM

School is in session for 175 days between the months of August and May.

Students typically earn 7 credits each school year. Credit recovery summer school is offered to our students in core subject areas.

Students attending Wyoming Connections Academy will be administered the Wyoming Test of Proficiency and Progress (WY-TOPP), or ACT as required by the state of Wyoming's educational accountability legislation. Travel may be required for testing.

Hathaway Scholarship – The State of Wyoming provides the opportunity for Wyoming students to earn scholarship money based on their GPA, ACT scores, and completion of the Hathaway Success Curriculum.

Wyoming Connections Academy offers many clubs and activities including Art Club, Book Club, Brainteasers, Broadcast Club, Chess Club, Debate Club, Digital Storytelling, D&D (Dungeons and Dragons) Club, Environmental Club, History Club, Math Club I, Math Club II: Math Olympiads, Monitor (Newspaper), Pen Pals, Pens and Lens, Poetry Corner I, In Quiz Bowl, Robotics Club, Science Club, Science in the Kitchen Club, and Student Leadership and Service Club.

SCHOOL AND FACULTY ACCOLADES

Wyoming Connections Academy has 26 full-time and 2 part-time certified professional staff. Of those, 20 certified staff members have earned advanced degrees. All teachers are highly qualified.

ACCREDITATIONS

Wyoming's K-12 districts are accredited by the Wyoming State Board of Education annually in accordance with W.S.21-2-304(a)(ii). The schools governed by each district are accredited through the district. Accreditation includes annual requirements as well as an on-site peer review once every five years. STUDENT POPULATION

Wyoming Connections Academy, in partnership with Big Horn County School District #1, includes a four-year comprehensive high school program with a current enrollment of 675 students. 375 of these students are in grades 9-12. Our students come from urban, suburban, and rural communities.

ADVANCED COURSE OPTIONS

AP course offerings include: Biology, Calculus, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Environmental Science, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Psychology, Statistics, U.S. Government, and U.S. History.

Honors course offerings include: Algebra I and II, American Government, Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, Economics, English 9-12, Geometry, Physical Science, Physics, Pre-Calculus, U.S. History, and World History.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Wyoming Connections Academy operates on a semester system utilizing Carnegie Units. One semester class equals one-half of a high school credit. Students taking high school level classes in middle school may be granted high school credit. Students attending Wyoming Connections Academy must meet the graduation requirements set by our partner, Big Horn County School District #1.
