GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Arkansas Connections Academy's core curriculum is geared toward preparing students for college and beyond. Students have access to AP, Honors, College Preparatory, and Basic programs. Students also can participate in the Post-Secondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) program, in which they can earn dual high school and college credit by attending post-secondary institutions.

Students at ARCA may have courses taken through our partnership with Pearson Online Academy. These courses are designated as PearsonOnlineAcademy-ar1 on the transcript.

Arkansas Connections Academy operates on a semester system utilizing Carnegie units. One semester class equals one-half of a high school credit.

Students who have taken high school level courses while in middle school may have been granted high school credit.

The typical course load is six classes per semester.
