

Graduation Requirements

Students must complete **each** section (Credits, Completion Requirements, and Graduation Pathways)

Credits Needed

Area and Subject Requirements	# of Credits
English	4
Math (at least through Algebra 2)	3
Social Sciences (0.5 Government/Civics, 1.0 of <i>either</i> US or World History, 0.5 Financial Literacy)	3
Science (2.0 must be lab-based)	4
Physical Education/Health (0.5 of each) During their high school career, students may earn a maximum of 1 credit in Physical Education or general elective credits when they complete 2 seasons of a sport.	1
World Language (if pursuing college 2.0 is recommended)	1
ICAP	1
Additional/Required Electives (0.5 technology, 0.5 art, 0.5 financial literacy)	5
Total Credits Needed:	22

Completion Requirements:

- Complete Connections Senior Capstone Course with a score of 100% on each lesson.
 - Comprised of many assignments throughout the year to help with your post-graduate planning
 - May include things like
 - Post-secondary Application
 - End of Year Presentation discussing
 - Your post-graduation plans
 - A reflection on your post-secondary experience hours
 - A research paper completed during high school
 - 40 hours of any combination of the following:
 - Community Service at an approved site
 - Internship
 - Complete a Concurrent Enrollment Course with a passing grade in one of the four core subject areas
 - Employment with a positive evaluation from a supervisor
 - The 40 hours can be waived if a student satisfies both the Math and English Graduation pathway by earning a qualifying SAT score.

Graduation Pathways/Cut Scores:

Students must demonstrate college or career readiness in English AND Math based on at least <u>ONE</u> of the following measures.
