- Indiana Connections Academy has over 180 certified and licensed educators and professional staff.
- The school year consists of 180 instructional days from August through June.
- Indiana Connections Academy opened in 2010.
- Students can earn up to 14 credits per academic year.
- All students in grades 3-11 must take part in the Indiana Statewide Testing.

ADVANCED COURSE OPTIONS

Our school offers honors-level and dual credit course options. We have a partnership with Ivy Tech and Trine to continue to implement the [Indiana College Core](#). We will have dual credit options in English, Math, and Social Studies.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Indiana Connections Academy operates on a semester system utilizing 1 credit per course per semester. Students who have taken high school level courses while in middle school may have been granted high school credit. The typical course load is six credits per semester.
