ADVANCED COURSE OPTIONS

AP Course Offerings Include: Biology, Calculus, Human Geography

Honors Course Offerings Include: Algebra I and II, American Government, Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, Economics, English 9-12, Geometry, Physical Science, Pre-Calculus, U.S. History, & World History.

Concurrent Enrollment: Available to Junior and Senior students, who can earn IWCC credits and high school credits at the same time. Each online IWCC class may earn up to four (4) college credits per semester and one (1) IACA credit per semester. Courses taken through IWCC will satisfy electives and, in some cases, core academic requirements.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

PATHWAYS TO GRADUATION

One of IACA's key initiatives is to support students and families in developing personalized pathways to Graduation and beyond. lowa Connections Academy (IACA) was selected as one of just four Connections Academy schools across the United States to begin offering a new program for students, beginning with the 2023-2024 school year. The Coursera program allows students to earn industry certifications in four areas, or domains. Additionally, the courses within these certifications will earn high school elective graduation credits. Certifications Offered: Google Digital Marketing & eCommerce, Google IT Support, Salesforce Sales Operations Specialist, and Meta Social Media Marketing. Coursera offers IACA students: validation of skills and knowledge; enhances their credibility in the marketplace; and opens the door to new job opportunities, promotions, and career advancements.

Traditional Diploma Pathway

Each of these opportunities run in conjunction or independent of postsecondary and other learning opportunities: Iowa Western Community College, CAM High School, and Iowa Connections Academy are working together to provide a number of educational opportunities for IACA students.
