OUR PROGRAM

STUDENT POPULATION

Kansas Connections Academy includes a four-year comprehensive high school program with an enrollment of approximately 700 high school students. Post-graduation plans for the class of 2024 include: 2-year college (21%), 4-year college (23%), vocational training (20%), employment (21%), and military (1%).

ADVANCED COURSE OPTIONS

AP course offerings include: Calculus AB, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Psychology, U.S. Government, US History.

Honors course offerings include: Algebra I and II, American Government, Biology, Chemistry, Earth Science, English 9-12, Geometry, Physical Science, Precalculus, U.S. History, and World History.

In 2021-2022 KCA had approx. 12.5% of 11th and 12th grade students participate in AP or Dual Credit Enrollment courses.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Kansas Connections Academy operates on a semester system using Carnegie units. One semester class equals one half of a high school credit. Students who have taken high school classes in middle school may have been granted high school credit. The typical course load is six or seven courses per semester.

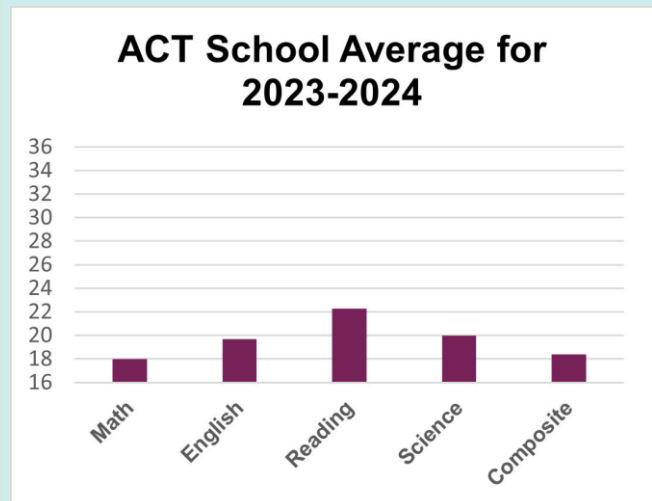
