OUR MISSION

The mission of TECCA is to offer Massachusetts students a quality public virtual school experience.

OUR SCHOOL

TECCA is accredited by the North Central Association Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement (NCA CASI), an accrediting division of Cognia. TECCA includes a four-year comprehensive high school program with an enrollment of 1,431 students. Here are some important facts about TECCA:

- School is in session 180 school days between the months of September and June.
- Students are able to earn up to 12-14 credits during the school year.
- For the 18-19 and 19-20 school years, courses were averaged, and one grade was reported per course. Prior to 2018 and moving forward with the 2020-2021 school year, grades and credits will be awarded on a semester basis.

STUDENT POPULATION

Our students come from urban, suburban, and rural communities. TECCA graduated its first senior class in June of 2015.

Post-graduation plans for the class of 2022 include two-year college (15%), four-year college (35%), employment (11%) and technical programming (7%).

ADVANCED COURSE OPTIONS

AP course offerings include Biology, Calculus AB, Computer Science Principles, Environmental Science, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Human Geography, Psychology, Spanish Language, United States Government and Politics, United States History.

Honors course offerings include English – Grades: 9-12, Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, Precalculus, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, American Government, US History I, US History II, and World History.

Dual Enrollment programs include UMass Amherst, Salem State University, Bristol Community College, Quinsigamond Community College and North Shore Community College.


GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

TECCA operates on a semester system utilizing Carnegie units. One semester class equals one-half of a high school credit. Students who have taken high school level courses while in middle school may have been granted high school credit. The typical course load is six classes per semester.
