OUR MISSION

The mission of TECCA is to offer Massachusetts students a quality public virtual school experience. Through a lens of diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging TEC Connections Academy will provide students a high quality, innovative, virtual public-school experience through access to education that empowers students to demonstrate respect, life skills, growth mindset, critical thinking, communication skills, and application of knowledge to prepare them for the next stage of their life's journey.

OUR SCHOOL

TECCA is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). TECCA includes a four-year comprehensive high school program with an enrollment of 1,725 students. Here are some important facts about TECCA:

- School is in session 180 school days between the months of September and June.
- Students can earn a maximum of 10 credits during the school year. On average students earn 6-7 credits per academic year.
- For the 18-19 and 19-20 school years, courses were averaged, and one grade was reported per course. Prior to 2018 and moving forward with the 2020-2021 school year, grades and credits will be awarded on a semester basis.

STUDENT POPULATION

Our students come from urban, suburban, and rural communities. TECCA graduated its first senior class in June of 2015.

Post-graduation plans for the class of 2024 include two-year college (17%), four-year college (34%), technical programming (20%), employment (20%) and volunteer/travel (9%).

ADVANCED COURSE OPTIONS

AP course offerings include Biology, Calculus AB, Computer Science Principles, Environmental Science, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Human Geography, Psychology, Spanish Language, United States Government and Politics, United States History.

Honors course offerings include English – Grades: 9-12, Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, Precalculus, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, American Government, US History I, US History II, and World History.

Dual Enrollment programs include UMass Amherst, Salem State University, Bristol Community College, Quinsigamond Community College, Bridgewater State University, and North Shore Community College.




GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

TECCA operates on a semester system utilizing Carnegie units. One semester class equals one-half of a high school credit. Students who have taken high school level courses while in middle school may have been granted high school credit. The typical course load is six classes per semester.

AP results for 2023-2024:

In the 2024-2025 school year, 74% of students who took AP exams at TECCA received a score of 3 or higher.

Due to the nature of the learning environment at TECCA courses and standards were unaltered during the pandemic and students were able to continue completing their coursework as usual.

Students at TECCA may also take courses through our partnership with Pearson Online Academy. These courses are designated as PearsonOnlineAcademy-ma1 on the transcript.

CAREER READINESS PROGRAM

Students in grades K-12 will have multiple opportunities aimed at fostering College and Career Readiness, ensuring they are well-prepared for success right after graduation.
