OUR MISSION

OUR SCHOOL

MassCa is accredited by the New England Association of Schools and Colleges (NEASC). MassCa includes a four-year comprehensive high school program with an enrollment of 1,725 students. Here are some important facts about MassCa:

- School is in session 180 school days between the months of September and June.
- Students can earn a maximum of 10 credits during the school year. On average students earn 6-7 credits per academic year.
- Grades and credits are awarded on a semester basis.

STUDENT POPULATION

Our students come from urban, suburban, and rural communities. MassCa graduated its first senior class in June of 2015.

Post-graduation plans for the class of 2026 include two-year college (19%), four-year college (32%), technical programming (20%), employment (20%) and volunteer/travel (9%).

ADVANCED COURSE OPTIONS

AP course offerings include Biology, Calculus AB, Computer Science Principles, Environmental Science, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, Human Geography, Psychology, Spanish Language, United States Government and Politics, United States History.

Honors course offerings include English – Grades: 9-12, Algebra 1, Geometry, Algebra 2, Precalculus, Biology, Chemistry, Physics, American Government, US History I, US History II, and World History.

Dual Enrollment programs include UMass Amherst, Salem State University, Bristol Community College, Quinsigamond Community College, Bridgewater State University, and North Shore Community College.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

MassCa operates on a semester system utilizing Carnegie units. One semester class equals one-half of a high school credit. Students who have taken high school level courses while in middle school may have been granted high school credit. The typical course load is six classes per semester.

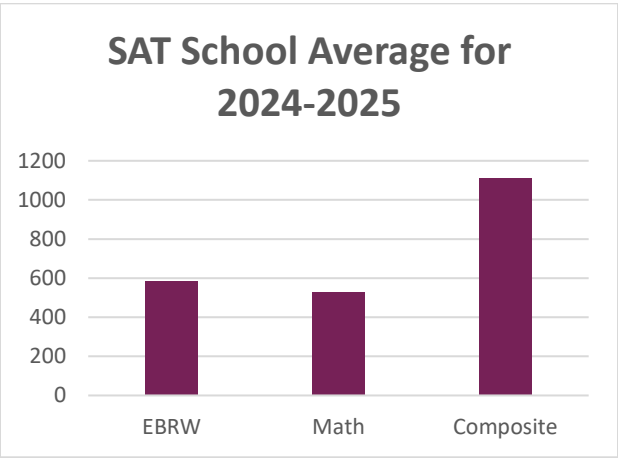
