HOW TO MAKE IT WORK FOR YOUR FAMILY

Here are eight most common types of Learning Coaches and our advice for each on how to best adapt to an online school environment.





STAY-AT-HOME **LEARNING COACH**

Take advantage of increased one-on-one time. While you're doing tasks around the house, prompt your student to ask and answer questions throughout their LiveLesson instruction time, establishing yourself as their guide.





MULTI-STUDENT LEARNING COACH

Group schedules, lessons, and students. Make coaching simple by creating identical student schedules! Encourage collaborative learning where students study subjects together.

Bonus Tip: Allow older students to serve mentors and tutors to younger children





PART-TIME WORKING LEARNING COACH

Utilize schedule alterations. If your work schedule changes, you can easily alter your student's core classes to occur later in the day when you're available.





FULL-TIME WORKING LEARNING COACH

Prioritize parent-teacher relationships. As a full-time working parent, you can rely on Connections Academy instructors to keep you involved in your child's education through text, email, or phone call.
